## **VALE JACK LINDSAY**

**2/4/33 to 28/1/18**

Known to the bridge world as Jack, John Wallace Lindsay was born in Dundee, Scotland. A talented sportsman, Jack played football [soccer] and table tennis at a high standard. In 1951 he entered the RAF to carry out his two years National Service – mostly in Egypt. Whilst there he played table-tennis for the RAF in Cyprus. After his National Service ended he spent some time with the Southampton Football Club playing for the 2<sup>nd</sup> and 3<sup>rd</sup> elevens but never made the top team.

He apparently continued with table tennis where he met his wife Margaret. He competed in the Masters Table Tennis Championships as recently as 2007, representing Australia in many places around the world.

In conversation some years ago Jack claimed that, with a friend [unnamed] they learnt to play bridge from a book [also unnamed] and just walked into a club [also unnamed] one night and played.... successfully!! An early and long-time member of the Hunters Hill Bridge Club, Jack retired from his typesetting business in Annandale in 1998 and moved to Umina with Margaret who was ill. He then joined the Brisbane Water Bridge Club where he served on the committee as Newsletter editor and Treasurer.

Jack was well-liked, with many bridge partnerships including:

Helen Ferguson, Yvonne Ferguson, Carol Judd, Nancye Joss, Marilyn Whigham, David Driscoll, Frances Lyons, Toni Dixon, Ronnie Ng and of course - Lorraine. Following Margaret's death after 47 years of marriage Jack and Lorraine added a marriage partnership to their bridge partnership.

Jack won at least a dozen trophies at our club alone and featured in our Intra-club teams at least 6 times. Jack had to stop playing when sadly dementia robbed him of his physical and mental abilities, but at that time he was a Grand Master with well over 2000 masterpoints.

One of the highlights with Lorraine was winning the Pairs and Teams in the Newcastle Congress 5 years ago.

Jack will be sadly missed by his three children, Lorraine and her family and many people in the Bridge world.

## **HEALTH & SAFETY**

As you may or may not know, Don Holmes had a nasty fall coming into club. He broke his nose, cut his face deeply, hurt his arm and remained in hospital for 2 nights with a small brain bleed.

Everything is fine again now and Don is back playing at our club. He wishes to thank everyone who helped him that day especially those people who cleaned up the blood. He is so grateful to the club (meaning its members) and knowing that he can't thank everyone individually, he has donated \$50 to our Bridge Club (possibly to restock our first Aid Kit).

We thank you Don and Maureen for your generosity.

Another consequence is that the Leagues Club has looked at the path. They said that even though the path is within safety guide lines, they will be doing some angle grinding to make the path even more level.

The protocol agreement between CCLC and us is that, for any accident, we ring the ambulance if necessary, then alert the Leagues Club. They will fill in their own incident report but we also have an accident file (pink cover) in the office and that must also be filled in.
